Calusa Chapter

Florida Planning and Zoning Association, Inc. Serving Collier, Charlotte, Collier, and Lee Counties By-laws – as of April 27, 2010

ARTICLE I – NAME

The name of this organization shall be the Calusa Chapter of the Florida Planning and Zoning Association, Inc., hereinafter called the Chapter.

This Chapter shall be a non-profit educational organization, operating under the sponsorship of the Florida Planning & Zoning Association, Inc. the objectives of both being in substantial agreement.

This Chapter shall embrace Charlotte, Collier, Hendry, and Lee Counties, but membership is not restricted to territorial limits.

ARTICLE II – PURPOSE

The purpose of the Chapter shall be to promote cooperation among official planning and zoning boards of commissions, civic bodies, citizens, technicians and students interested in planning and zoning in the Chapter area; to cultivate and stimulate an interest in planning and zoning by local governments; to encourage the observance of sound planning and zoning practices; to furnish information, advice and assistance to its members and provide a medium for exchanging information, advice and assistance among them; to encourage and promote professional relationships and educational experiences with other land planning disciplines; and to exchange in research and issue publications on planning and zoning related matters.

ARTICLE III – MEMBERSHIP

An individual or organizational member of the Florida Planning and Zoning Association, Inc., in good standing, shall be eligible for membership in the Chapter. The Chapter shall have the following classifications of membership:

- A. INDIVIDUAL MEMBER. Any person wishing to further the purpose of the Chapter and to participate in its activities.
- B. ORGANIZATIONAL MEMBER. Any governmental agency or board, consulting firms, business and trade associations, Chambers of Commerce, industrial promotion groups, industries and similar organizations wishing to further the purpose of the Association. This classification also includes local, regional, and state agencies boards, and commission not included in other categories.
- C. HONORARY MEMBER. Any person of marked attainment in planning or civic improvement, or any person who has rendered outstanding service to the Chapter, who shall have been elected by unanimous vote of the Board of Directors.
- D. PUBLICLY ELECTED AND APPOINTED PLANNING BOARD OFFICIALS. Boards of County Commissioners, City Councils, Planning and/or Zoning Commissioners, and Boards of Adjustments shall be entitled to this classification.

E. STUDENT MEMBER. Any full time student wishing to further the purpose of the Chapter and to participate in its activities.

MEMBERSHIP PRIVILEGES

The several membership classifications shall be granted the following privileges:

A. INDIVIDUAL MEMBER. May participate in annual and special meetings, vote, hold office, serve on committees and receive all publications of the Association. Membership certificates will bear name of the individual.

B. ORGANIZATIONAL MEMBER. Individual membership privileges for a maximum of three members of the agency or firms. Membership certificate will bear name of the organization. Separate membership certificates will bear name of the agency/firm and the individuals. Organization will receive all publications of the Association.

C. HONORARY MEMBER. May participate in meetings, vote, serve on committees and receive all publications of the Association, but may not hold office. Membership certificate will bear the name of the honorary member.

ARTICLE IV – VOTING

Voting – All individual or organizational members are eligible to attend and participate in meetings of the Chapter. All members are entitled to one vote.

ARTICLE V – DUES

Any dues or fees for the administration and operation of the Chapter shall be determined by the Board of Directors, subject to approval by a majority vote of the members.

The fiscal year for the Chapter shall be the same as the fiscal year of the parent organization. (January 1 to December 31)

ARTICLE VI – ADMINISTRATION

OFFICERS. The elective officers of the Chapter shall be: President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, and up to six (6) Directors. The Chapter shall have a maximum of two "State Directors" to serve on the Board of Directors of the Florida Planning and Zoning Association. The State Director(s) shall be elected by majority vote of the general membership annually.

ELIGIBILITY. Only members in good standing holding Individual or Organizational memberships shall be eligible to hold office in the Chapter.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS. The Board of Directors shall be composed of the Officers who shall perform duties set forth in the Chapter By-Laws.

EMOLUMENTS. No officer, director, committeemen, appointee or member shall receive a salary or compensation for expenses incurred, except those approved by the Board of Directors.

TERM OF OFFICE. Officers and Directors shall be installed at the Annual June meeting and shall serve until their respective successors have been duly named.

VACANCIES. A vacancy occurring in any office shall be filled by a majority vote of the remaining officers.

ARTICLE VII – ELECTION OF OFFICERS

The President shall call for nominations from the floor at the regular May meeting. Nominations may be mailed or emailed to the Board of Directors within five days after the regular May meeting. Not less than twenty (20) days prior to the regular June meeting, the Secretary shall prepare and email to each active Calusa Chapter member in good standing, a ballot of the candidates for office. The completed ballots may be faxed or emailed prior to or at the June meeting.

Election shall be according to returned ballots and the vote taken at the June meeting. The Secretary shall verify the ballots.

The candidates receiving the highest number of votes shall be declared elected for a period of one year. The results of the election shall be submitted to the membership following the June meeting.

ARTICLE VIII – COMMITTEES

Standing and special committees, as may be deemed necessary, shall be appointed by the President.

ARTICLE IX – MEETINGS

The annual meeting shall be held in June of each year. No less than six (6) regular meetings shall be held during the fiscal year and the time and place of such meetings shall be determined by the Board of Directors. A notice of all meetings shall be mailed to the members by the Secretary, not less than seven days before the date of the meeting.

ARTICLE X – AMENDMENTS

These By-Laws may be amended at any regular meeting of the Chapter by a two-thirds vote of the members in good standing, present and voting, provided the proposed amendment has been submitted to the Board of Directors for review. No proposed amendment shall be presented to the membership unless approved by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE XI – PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

"Robert's Rules of Order, Revised" shall be the parliamentary authority for the Chapter, whenever they are not inconsistent with the By-Laws or Rules of the Chapter.

ARTICLE XII – EFFECTIVE DATE

These By-Laws shall become effective upon adoption by two-thirds vote of the members in good standing present and voting.
